2-B-2 details and explanations:

1. This agreement is subject to change if the State of Illinois teaching certification requirements change. Otherwise, the agreement will be honored for four years starting from and including the student's start year at Oakton in 2007-2008.
2. The AAT degree at Oakton completes the General Education Core Curriculum of the Illinois Articulation Initiative, also called the IAI. Per DePaul's IAI agreement, students would need to complete any two Religious Dimension courses and two specified Philosophical Inquiry courses, the experiential learning requirement, and the capstone requirement. All course requirements are listed in the agreement.
3. If student does not take the additional concentration courses before transferring to DePaul, the courses must be taken at DePaul, which will take more than six quarters at DePaul.
4. Student must pass competence test in Basic Technology Literacy, EDU 025 during first quarter at DePaul.
5. ECE 104, Introduction to Early Childhood at Oakton, does not have an equivalent at DePaul, but as part of this agreement, it will be used to award one hour of transfer credit for ECE 093, the clinical experience portion of ECE 310 at DePaul. Students will be awarded one hour of transfer credit for ECE 104 taken at Oakton.
6. Students must get a grade of C or better in all major and concentration courses. Additionally, to graduate from DePaul, the School of Education requires that students graduate with a cumulative GPA of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale. This GPA will be calculated on DePaul course work only.
7. Students must pass the Basic Skills test while enrolled at Oakton. Basic Skills test information can be found on the Illinois Certification Testing System Web Site:

8. To choose a transferable concentration course, check the transfer course list between DePaul and Oakton at: www.depaul.edu/transfercourses. Concentrations include but are not limited to following areas: Anthropology, Arabic, Art, Biology, Catholic Studies, Chemistry, Chinese, Communications, Economics, English, Environmental Science, French, Geography, German, History, Italian, Math, Philosophy, Physics, Political Science, Psychology, Religious Studies, Sociology or Spanish.
9. To graduate, you must pass the Basic Skills test, the Content Area test, and applicable APT tests.
10. This 2-bridge-2 agreement was designed for entry into DePaul at the Autumn quarter. Many of the Education courses are listed in the quarters that they are offered at DePaul; however, the courses may be taken in different quarters than indicated on the agreement.
