Eligibility Requirements

To be considered for a School for New Learning (SNL) scholarship at DePaul, you must:

- Apply to a competence-based or joint-degree program in the School for New Learning. Students applying to an SNL degree-completion program or any other non-SNL program are not eligible for this award. Please visit depaul.edu/scholarships for more information on other scholarship possibilities.
Be a first-time student at DePaul looking to begin course work in the fall, winter or spring quarter. Returning DePaul students are not eligible for this award.
Have a GPA of 2.75 or better for course work completed at the most recent institution attended.
Submit this scholarship application along with a personal statement by the following deadlines:

Fall Quarter Applicants: June 1

Winter Quarter Applicants: November 1

Spring Quarter Applicants: February 1

Renewal Requirements

- New SNL undergraduate students will receive a second year of funding provided they make satisfactory academic progress as defined by the faculty in the School for New Learning.
New students must be continuously enrolled in courses each term (excluding summer quarter). Exceptions will be made only for students who must step out of the program for reasons defined by our administrative withdrawal policy and who formally apply for this option.

FULL-TIME STUDENTS

New full-time students are eligible for \$2,000 in scholarship dollars their first year and \$2,000 in scholarship dollars in year two. Funds will be distributed in three equal installments in year one and three equal installments in year two assuming a student makes satisfactory academic progress. These are merit-based, tuition-restricted scholarships.

PART-TIME STUDENTS

New part-time students (students who enroll in 6-11 credit hours per term) are eligible to receive a \$1,000 scholarship for their first year and a \$1,000 scholarship in year two. These funds will be distributed in three equal installments during year one and three equal installments in year two assuming a student makes satisfactory academic progress. These are merit-based, tuition-restricted scholarships.
