New LAS Programs for 2018

B.A. in Commercial French or German or Italian: Designed for students interested in complementing their advanced intercultural language study with a foundation in international business skills.

Minor in Chicago Studies: Designed for students who seek to deepen their understanding of Chicago's urban and social issues, as well as those who are drawn to community-based learning experiences.

Minor in Creative Practice: Art and Writing: Designed for students who want a cross-disciplinary approach to a creative arts practice in art-making and creative writing. Not available to English majors.

Noteworthy LAS Majors for 2018

B.A. in African and Black Diaspora Studies: Students will explore the Black experience from a variety of perspectives, including but not limited to historical, artistic, sociological, anthropological, and philosophical approaches. In addition to the diverse cultures and societies that make up the global African Diaspora.

B.A. or minor in Criminology: Designed to prepare students interested in a variety of professions within the criminal legal system and issues of social justice to study the frequency, location and cause of crime. Learn how to collect data, analyze findings and present policy recommendations to improve the criminal legal system for both victims and offenders.

B.F.A. in Art, Media, and Design: Designed as a studio specific curriculum with a focused foundation in studio art practice. Students will approach their B.F.A. through three concentrations: Studio, Photography and Media Art, and Graphic Art.

B.A. in Latin American & Latina/o Studies: Students will explore the Latin American and Latina/o experience from a variety of perspectives, including but not limited to historical, artistic, sociological, anthropological, and philosophical approaches. In addition to the diverse cultures and societies that link Latin America and the United States.

B.A. in Peace, Justice and Conflict Studies: Students will critically examine the origins and root causes of violence and conflict, and learn strategies for resolving interpersonal, communal and international conflicts peacefully. In addition, students will master the theoretical and intellectual frameworks related to peace building, human rights advocacy and justice development.

B.A. in Women and Gender Studies: Students will focus on examining women's and men's identities and experiences in relation to gender, race, class and culture; addresses issues of power and resistance; and connects feminist theories and research to public policy and social justice.

Course Recommendations for Prospective LAS Transfer Students

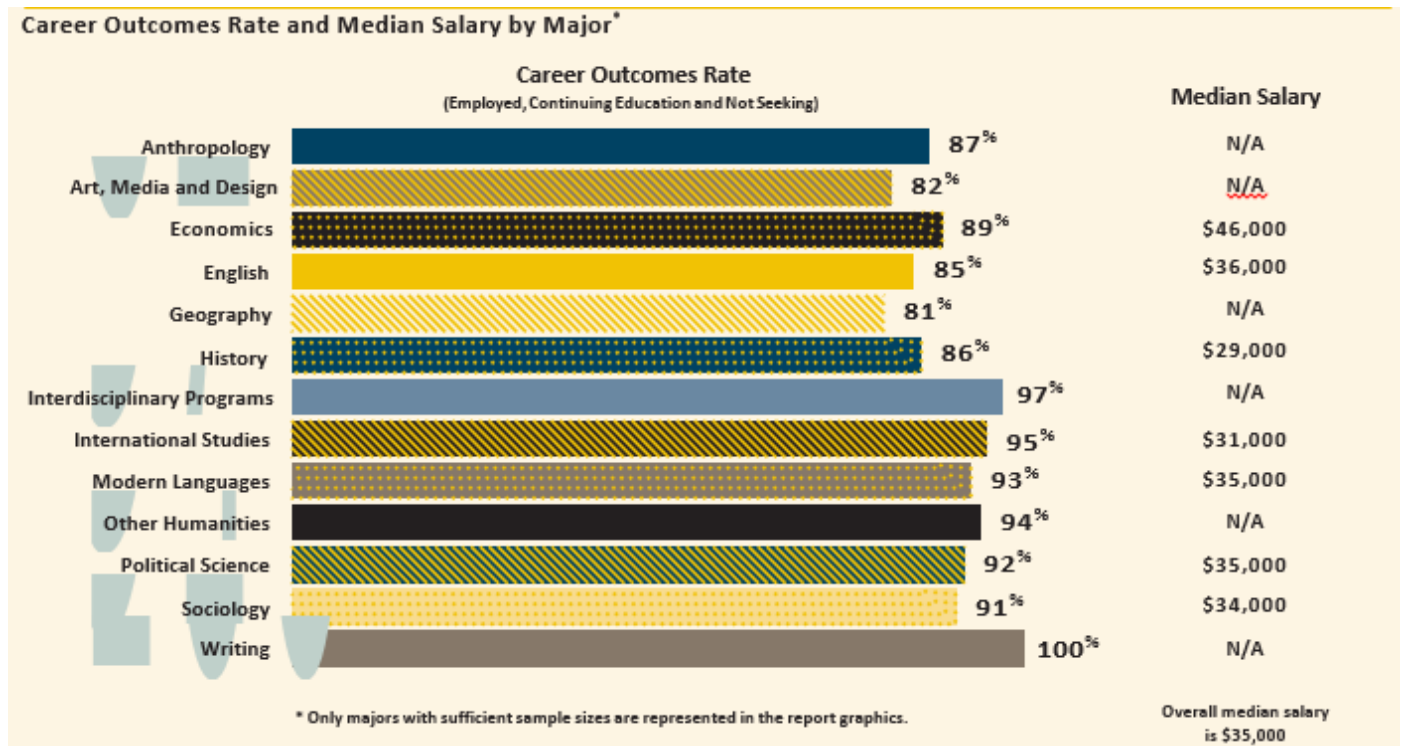
Prospective LAS transfer students should focus on completing their composition sequence, an advanced math or quantitative reasoning course, a natural science course with a lab, a year of foreign language, and introductory courses in the humanities and social sciences.

LAS Encourages and Welcomes Transfer Students that have completed IAI/GECC

Prospective LAS transfer students are encouraged to complete the requirements for the IAI/GECC. By completing the IAI/GECC, these transfer students are exempt from taking two courses: 1. Math and Technological Literacy II - LSP 121, and 2. Second year seminar course - LSP 200.
